

Information on opt-out options from data processing

What are cookies and what categories of cookies are there?

A cookie is a small file that is stored in the terminal browser upon viewing the website. With the help of cookies e.g. the respective terminal can be identified or a complete and correct display of our website can be guaranteed. Cookies also help to provide the services integrated into the website, to personalize content as well as to individually adapt and analyze ads.

Depending on their function and their purpose, cookies can be divided into five categories.

1. **Necessary cookies** are used so that you can navigate on our websites and use the website's basic features.
2. **Performance cookies** are used in order to improve our website's user-friendliness. Performance cookies collect information on utilization of our websites e.g. internet browser and operating system that are used, domain name of the website you came from, number of visits, average stay and viewed pages.
3. **Analysis cookies** are used in order to improve our website's user-friendliness. With analysis cookies, we can find out how our website is used and e.g. based on which preferences and search keywords it is accessed.
4. **Advertising cookies** are used in order to offer you more targeted relevant content. They are also used to measure and control the effectiveness of advertising campaigns. Marketing cookies record if a website is visited and what content is used. This information may possibly be shared with third parties such as advertisers, and are often linked to third party site features (third party cookies).
5. **Social media cookies** are set by social networks. For example, you may register with our website via the login data of a social network.

How can I delete cookies or turn off tracking?

Via your browser settings, you can **delete** individual cookies or **all cookies**. In addition, you receive information and instructions on how to block storing beforehand, depending on your browser provider:

You can also manage many companies' cookies and features individually, which are used for advertising. For that, use the respective user tools, retrievable at <https://www.aboutads.info/choices/> or <http://www.youronlinechoices.com/uk/your-ad-choices>.

Most browsers also offer a so-called „**do-not-track feature**“ with which you can indicate that you do not wish to be “followed” by websites. If this feature is activated, the respective browser tells advertising networks, websites and applications that you do not wish to be tracked for the purpose of behavior-related advertising and suchlike. In addition, you can standardly prevent the download of so-called scripts. **NoScript** allows the execution of JavaScript, Java and other plugins only with trustworthy domains of your choice. Google Analytics can analyze on a website where users come from and how they behave on the website.</p> <p>In order to record and analyze the streams of visitors using Google Analytics, the tracking code (“tag”) is incorporated into our website via the Google Tag Manager.</p> <p>As part of Google Analytics, we also use the application GA Audiences in order to only show ads placed within Google advertising services and those of their partners to such users who showed interest in our online product or who have certain characteristics (e.g. interest in certain topics or products which are determined based on the visited websites) that we share with Google. With the help of remarketing audiences we also want to make sure that our ads match the users’ potential interest and do not have an annoying effect.</p> <p>Please find details on the tools, the purpose of processing and the provider’s data privacy here.</p>	<p>On our behalf, the analysis tools will analyze our website’s use with the aid of of set cookies and put together reports on website activities for Timify.</p> <p>We use an anonymized IP for all used analysis tools, either your IP address is shortened or replaced by a generic IP upon viewing our website. <p>DoubleClick is an advertising tool by the provider Google with the help of which interest-related ads for visitors on our website and third-party websites can be placed and shown, assigning a pseudonymous identification number (ID) to your browser in order to check which ads were shown to your browser and which ads were clicked on. Using a DoubleClick cookie enables Google to place ads on the basis of previous visits on our or other websites.</p> <p>Please find more information on use and data privacy by the provider here.</p>	<p>You can prevent storage of the cookies set with this tool through the respective browser setting by deactivating the execution of JavaScript in your browser or installing a tool such as ‘NoScript’ (see above).</p> <p>In addition, you can prevent processing the data (including your IP address) created by the cookies and based on your use of the website by downloading and installing the browser plugin available at the following link:</p> <p>https://www.google.com/settings/ads/plugin?hl=de</p>
